## I. GENERAL COMMENTS:

Due to extenuating circumstances in his personal life—a child about to be born, Cpl. Hvizdzak designated Sgt. Hubbard to oversee the inspection. The facility is somewhat dated and cramped but serves its purposes. Adults and minors have separate entrances into, and holding areas in, the facility. Appropriate signage is posted in the holding area for minors. Snacks, bottled water, certain toiletries, and blankets are available for minors.

Upon arrival, Sgt. Hubbard gave us a brief tour of the facility, including all areas used for minor detainees. She then sat us down in an interview room with a table and chairs and provided us with a binder divided into the 12 months of the year, and containing the secure and nonsecure detention records for minor detainees. Sgt. Hubbard was friendly and helpful throughout the inspection.
